



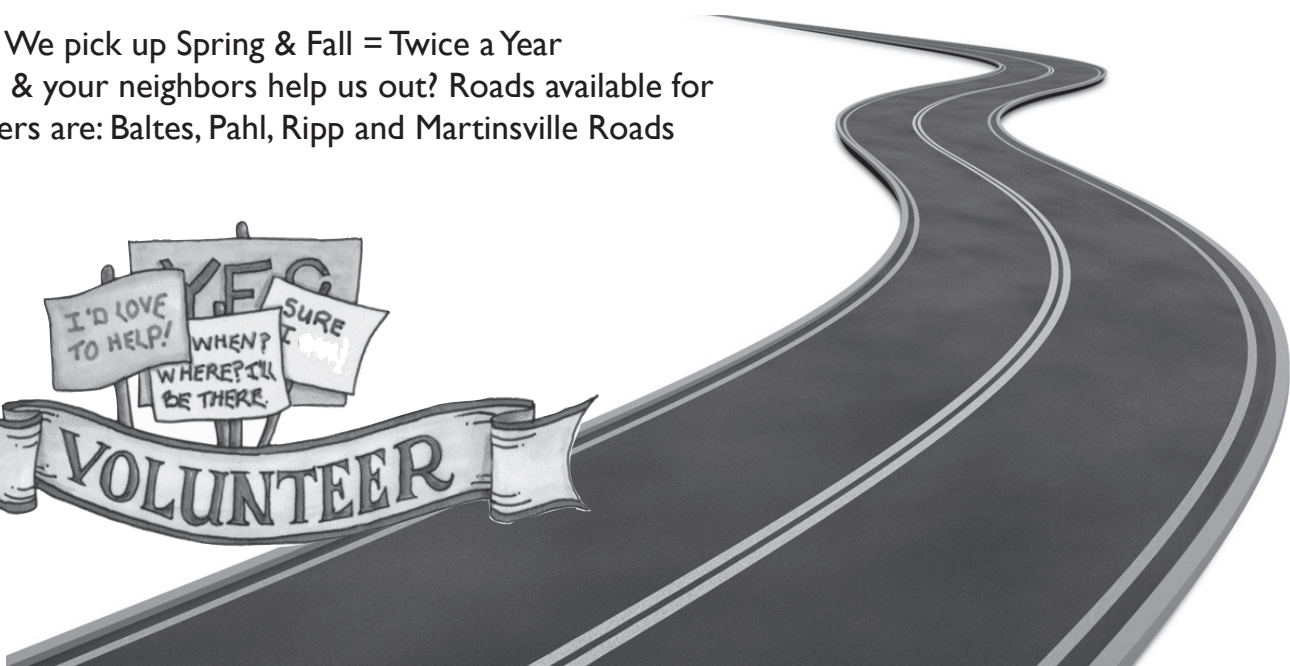
HATS OFF TO THE VOLUNTEERS OF SPRINGFIELD!!

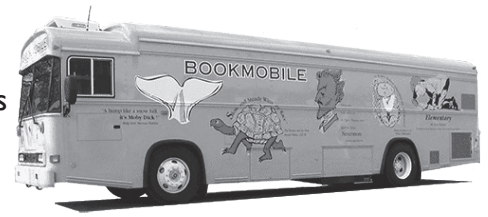

BOOKMOBILE LOCATIONS IN SPRINGFIELD

The Dane County Library Service has the Bookmobile scheduled for Saturdays at Don's Mobile Manor, Kalesey Ct. from 9:30-10:30 a.m., St. Martins Church from 1:30-2:15 p.m. and at St. Peters Church from 2:45-3:45 p.m. in Ashton. Besides loaning out books, DVDs, magazines and music CDs, there will be a Crafts and Fun Summer Reading Program at the Don's Mobile manor location. You can also find large print books at the Town Hall delivered once a month from the Dane County Library. These are available for check out to all residents. We encourage you to use these services as your tax dollars support them. DISPOSAL OF LARGE ITEMS

for town residents only, on Saturday, October 4, 2014 from 8 a.m. to noon, you will be able to drop off your large items for recycling. Dumpsters will be available in the Town Hall parking lot and you will need to unload your items into the dumpster. Large items include furniture, mattresses, carpet, water softeners, humidifiers but NOT dehumidifiers, small amount of wood products (cabinet or scrap wood), sinks, toilets, etc. We can't accept appliances, construction materials, stone, concrete, sod, large auto parts, tree limbs, branches, leaves, grass or stumps. A reminder that hazardous materials (paint, pesticides, petroleum products such as oil and solvents and explosives) are not accepted either but you can drop these off at the Clean Sweep program at 7102 US Hwy 12/18 in Madison (call 608-243-0368 for details on the Clean Sweep Program). If you are not sure about an item, please call us ahead of time and we will check with Waste Management if it is acceptable. There will be another opportunity in the spring for dropping off large items as this event will take place twice a year.



PROPERTY TAX BILLS

If you owe the second half of your property tax you should have received a bill from the Dane County Treasurer by now. Make sure you write your check out to the DANE COUNTY TREASURER and mail it to them. The town does not collect taxes during this time. Payment is due by July 31, 2014 or interest and penalty will be charged. If you have questions, please call the Dane County Treasurer at (608) 266-4151.

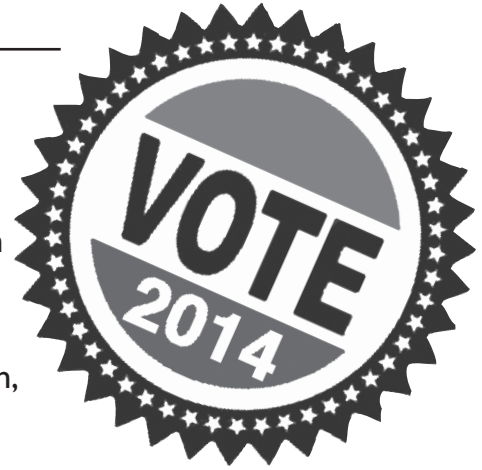


TOWN HALL AVAILABLE FOR USE:

Any resident of the town may use the town hall for private functions. You need to contact the town staff to reserve a date, fill out a form and discuss the details. You will have to put down a \$25.00 deposit which is returned if everything is left in good condition. Let us know if we can help you.

FALL PARTISAN PRIMARY

Will be held Tuesday, August 12, 2014 for the following: Senator, Congressional, State Legislative and County offices. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the town hall. Absentee voting is available, you can request an absentee ballot to be mailed to you by getting an application through the <https://myvote.wi.gov/>, mail the application to the Town Hall or stop in and fill one out here. The deadline for taking application to vote absentee by mail is 5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, August 7, 2014.



The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is July 28, 2014. The deadline for voting an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before the election, August 8, 2014.

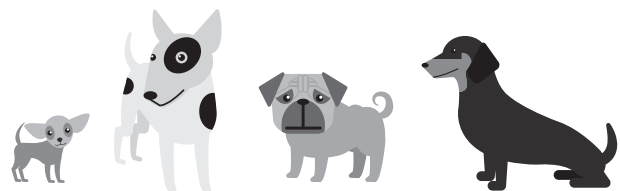
July 23rd is the last day for electors to register by mail to vote in Partisan Primary. You can also do this through the <https://myvote.wi.gov/> site. Mailed registrations must be postmarked no later than this date. (After this date, electors must register in person in municipal clerk's office or at the polls). All registrations must be signed and have proper proof of residency.

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:

- Please keep your dog on your own property. This includes keeping your dog from GREETING neighbors as they walk by or bikers as they ride by, it can be very intimidating to the person and their dog.
- When you take your dog for a walk, be sure to clean up after him/her. No one appreciates cleaning up after someone else's pet.
- Dogs on the loose love to dig in the garbage and make a mess for everyone. Keep your dog on your property or on a leash when off.
- Barking dogs do not make for good neighbors.
- Dogs over 5 months of age must by law be licensed. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for the staff at the town hall to issue a license.

TOWN BOARD MEETING TIMES

The Town Board holds their regular monthly meetings on the first and third Tuesdays of the month. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. at the Town Hall (6157 County Highway P). Agendas are posted at the Town Hall, Schneider Road Business Center on Schneider Road and the parking lot at the corner of Church Rd. & Co. Hwy. K and at www.town.springfield.wi.us. If a meeting time should be changed, it will also be posted. Our official newspapers are the Waunakee Tribune and the Middleton Times-Tribune. To be placed on the agenda contact the office at 849-7887.

PLAN COMMISSION

The Planning Commission meets the first Monday of the month at 7:30 p.m. at the Town Hall upon demand. The Commission hears zoning and re-zoning requests, land division requests and amendments to Dane County zoning ordinances. They act in an advisory capacity to the Town Board. Please contact the office to be placed on the agenda and to file the necessary papers for your request.

There is an open seat on the Plan Commission, if you would be interested in filling this vacancy, please contact the Town Hall.

BUILDING PERMITS & INSPECTIONS

The Town contracts with the firm "Independent Inspections, LTD" for a building inspector. Office hours are Wednesday from 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. at the Town Hall or call # 1-800-422-5220 anytime. Permits are required for all residential, agricultural and commercial buildings. Some remodeling also requires a building permit. Re-siding, re-roofing and finishing of interior surfaces (e.g. carpeting) shall be exempt from permit requirements. Dane County also requires building permits and zoning requirements. We suggest that you call 266-4266 with questions regarding their regulations. Driveway permits are needed whenever you replace or resurface your driveway.
